# **ACADEMICS**



## **ARTS**

Approximately 40% of the Bryan High School student body participates in our outstanding music program. The BHS and BMS bands boast students at the Bowling Green State University Honors Band and OMEA District 1 Honors Band. The vocal department includes Lightshines, A Capella, and Men's and Women's Choir. The vocal program is represented at the Black Swamp Honors Choir and in the OMEA All-State Choir each year. The strings department includes Orchestra and Chamber Strings. The BHS Orchestra celebrates students selected for the OMEA District 1 Honors Orchestra.

Bryan High School is proud to offer students a wide variety of visual art courses. Nearly 245 High School students take an art class each year. This means that nearly 40% of the BHS student body participate in visual arts!

The award winning artwork of our High School students is often featured in local and regional shows around the area, including: The Celebrating Art Show, The Focus Art Show (regional show), The Governor's Youth Art Exhibition (state show), the Scholastic Art and Writing National Show, and the K-12 National \Ceramics Exhibition.

# **SERVICES**

The District serves our students with special needs through a dedicated group of Intervention Specialists to help all students. A variety of support services are in place, including pull-out services for one-on-one support, inclusion co-teaching classrooms, and cross-categorical classes, which help

all students to be successful.

Student health care is a top priority for the Bryan City School District. The District has a full-time registered nurse on staff to maintain an open line of communication with parents to best meet student needs.

Bryan Elementary School is home to Catcher, our very own Therapy Dog! Catcher is used to help calm and ease anxiety in students which is beneficial for students and staff.

The District's Transportation Department organizes in-town busing in order to minimize exposure to traffic and weather elements. Group bus stops have been generated in most areas of town.

In addition to two full time school resource officers, the district utilizes online systems to maintain, distribute, and communicate district operating plans and information to staff and parents through the use of mobile devices and technology. These safety precautions help ensure the safety of our students for all types of potential emergency situations.

BCS employs two full time licensed social workers. Our social workers are a link between family, school and the community in providing support for students' academic and social growth.



# COMMUNITY

Educational experiences are enhanced by partnerships between the Bryan City School District and our community. The Bryan community is dedicated to our students.

The Bryan Athletic Booster Club donates an average of \$22,000 annually to our various



athletic programs.

The PTO generously
donated over \$7500 to

Bryan's Rotary International club partners with BCS to have Rotarians volunteer time in PK-5 classrooms and read with students weekly.

Bryan's City Schools' Bear Bags is a program that provides supplemental food to community families in need. Students are given a backpack of donated food every Friday in an effort to help meet the family's needs over the weekend.

Each Veteran's Day, the district's students and staff honor local heroes with a Veteran's Day ceremony. This patriotic opportunity to honor veterans is highlighted by guest speakers addressing the students. A Wall of Honor is also on display in the Athletic Lobby of the MS/HS. Names of BCS graduates, attendees, and employees are recognised on this wall for their service and sacrifice.





# **FISCAL**

Fiscal responsibility continues to be a focus in all aspects at BCS. Spending with a purpose and prioritizing resources that directly, and positively, impact our students is the key to financial expenditures.

We have been able to maintain our quality programming, staffing, and transportation services. As we monitor revenue we strategically plan for any possibility, both in the short term and vision for the long term.

BCS completed another round of refinancing for the school improvement bonds associated with the new MS/HS and Elementary remodeling building projects. During the refinancing process there was high interest from purchasing agents. This was great news for BCS as the refinancing process led to an added savings of \$905,537.08. This now brings the total savings on the original bonds to \$3,611,667.66. We are very pleased to save our taxpayers \$3,611,667.66 over the course of the bond life.

The recent passage of the State's Fair Funding Model will allow BCS to be the recipient of slightly increased funds from the state that will help alleviate the projected deficits created from the recent "funding cap." In an effort to maintain stability for the district and to be able to continue to provide opportunities to our students, BCS will be pursuing a levy renewal, in the form of a substitute levy, which generates \$1.9 million (or 9% of operational revenues) to the district annually. This levy, which will not be a new tax and will not seek any new money, would last for a continuing period of time, versus needing to be renewed every 5 years. For this reason, the levy is placed on the ballot as a Substitute Levy instead of the more familiar term known as a "Renewal" levy. If passed, it would lock in a state share of 10% (\$191,000), which is a continued savings to our taxpayers.

Again, this Substitute Levy is not a new tax and will not generate new money, but rather will seek to renew the existing operating levy for a continuing period of time. The Substitute levy will be on the November 2021 ballot.
